A HISTORY OF CARE

Since 1985, the UMC Foundation has enhanced and supported UMC's senior care by helping to provide security and peace of mind for our residents and their families. Through the generous gifts of our donors – family members, other residents, churches, local organizations, and business partners – the UMC Foundation has raised over \$56 million for UMC to support seniors in our care. This is especially important because every year, roughly 50 residents outlive their financial resources and must rely primarily on benevolent care.

PEACE OF MIND, FOR RESIDENTS AND LOVED ONES

Thanks to the generosity of UMC Foundation donors, no resident has ever been asked to leave UMC due to their inability to pay the total cost of care. Instead, residents in their 70s, 80s, 90s, and even 100s can continue to experience abundant life in the communities they call home. Life in a UMC community is a time to learn, connect, and create meaningful relationships. In John 10:10, Jesus promises that He came to provide life abundant. That is the heartbeat behind the mission of the UMC Foundation – helping residents experience abundant living as they age well and enjoy compassionate care and security.
