


Supporting the Next Generation of Healthcare Workers: Herve's Story

Herve Sanon's journey has been defined by one principle: "Commitment is an act, not a word."



Herve had already earned his associates degree through Essex County Newark Tech High School's early college program, and informed UMC of his plans to attend Lehigh University and major in public health while pursuing their 4+1 Master of Public Health program. He shared his goal of serving immigrant and under-resourced communities and his dream of helping position access, advocacy, and human connection as the heart of health and wellness outreach.

Thanks to the generosity of the Bishop Taylor community, senior housing mission team, and UMC Foundation, Herve was able to meet his \$1,000 fundraising goal and received enough financial support to cover books, school supplies, and some essential technology to get him started on his college career. Bishop Taylor's social services coordinator, Asia Saxton, led the effort and noted, *"It's truly inspiring to have so many caring people invest in a young person's future."*

This scholarship represents more than just financial support, however. It reflects a community coming together to encourage growth and invest in the next generation. Herve is profoundly grateful for the way his community rallied around him, and he looks forward to turning their generosity into action, declaring, "I don't just want to study public health...I want to live it, lead with it, and use it to build stronger, more compassionate communities."

Born in Haiti and raised in Newark, NJ, Herve has always been guided by a deep sense of responsibility and care for his elders. When his grandparents moved to Bishop Taylor Manor, one of UMC's senior affordable housing apartments, his aunt juggled serving as their primary caregiver while also working a full-time job. Still a young teenager, Herve stepped in to help by cooking traditional Haitian meals, managing medications, attending medical appointments, and assisting his grandparents with everyday tasks and errands. His actions not only helped his family but also gave him a deeper understanding of the challenges many older adults face. This inspired his growing passion for public health and cemented him as part of the Bishop Taylor family.

OUR PURPOSE


